We are pleased to have **DUCKMANDU** also playing for this month's meeting. **Aaron Seeman**'s onslaught of solo accordion and vocals has astounded audiences of all shapes and sizes. His repertoire includes, but is not limited to, 70's rock, Broadway, klezmer, classical, country, Sousa marches, punk rock, and even a polka or two.

In addition to his accordionizationizing, Aaron Seeman is a founding member, arranger, and vocalist with San Francisco's <u>Punk Rock</u> <u>Orchestra</u>, which performs full scale orchestral versions of classic punk songs. He also plays accordion in <u>Shamalamacord</u>, <u>Polkacide</u>, and <u>Red Hot Chachkas</u>. He is the composer of a modern

classical opera "Opium: Diary of a Cure". In his CD "Quack Rock: Five Duckades of Accordion Mega-Hits!", rather than play hokey accordion versions of these songs, Aaron seeks to demonstrate that accordion and vocals alone can evoke the spirit of the song, whether the hard driving rock of AC/DC, the wide vocal range and sonic landscape of Boston, or the grunge pioneers Nirvana.





# TATIANA SEMICHASTNAYA AND STEVE ALBINI

We are so lucky to also have **Tatiana Semichastnaya** and **Steve Albini** who will be playing their "passion and fire" Italian music fused with jazz and world rhythms.



They have enchanted audiences throughout the United States, Italy and the world with a blend of musical virtuosity and artistic passion.

Steve is a multi-instrumentalist and singer.

Tatiana, originally from Russia, has performed as an accordionist in the Las Vegas Cirque De Soleil show.

In addition to Steve and Tatiana, Steve's cousin Amanda Albini will be playing drums. She is a high school senior and fantastic drummer. She is currently auditioning for USC and UCLA and plans to major in music.

# **Also Playing: Scott Anderson**

New member Scott Anderson will perform several pieces for us as well. Scott was exposed to accordion music while living in Paris as a child, and later in San Antonio, Texas. He began studying with **Lou Jacklich** 15 years, and says "I may be Lou's slowest learning student, but the accordion rounds out my life and has introduced me to many friends". Scott also participated in **Richard Yaus'** "Orchestra Project" over the summer.

The November meeting opened early with the Jam Band. Nine players joined in, including **Frank** 



Montoro and Skyler's student, Joy, who was attending for the first time. Don Savant's granddaughter Fernanda played her K-saxophone. The music was a mixture of Christmas and Band favorites,

finishing with a rousing Beer Barrel polka.

**Skyler Fell** was next. She played her beautiful 1920 Dallape accordion and jokingly remarked – "They call me Yellow Bellow", referring to the unique color of her bellows. She started the

afternoon with 3 pieces in minor key- almost medieval music theme. *The Chocolate Shop* was composed by Skyler's friend Cate who passed away very recently. Skyler then played a Balkan piece based on *Bubamara* (lady bug) by Goran Bregovic, then a French



chanson *Mon Amant de Saint-Jean* (My lover of St Jean). She finished with quite a change of pace: *Bella Ciao*. This was actually an antifascist song from the 30s, but it has evolved into a general protest song. It was good, with quite ironic words.

Then it was **Reno Di Bono**'s turn. Reno too had an interesting accordion – a brand new Victoria. The exterior is all wood. Reno started with two Frosini pieces: *Olive Blossom*, followed by *Serenata Primavera*. The latter was a waltz, but Reno morphed it into a bossa nova. Then he played *Por Una Cabeza*, from the movie <u>Scent of a Woman</u>. It is a haunting tango. He followed this with a jazz version of *These Foolish Things*. Then Reno said that he would play something Italian. In fact, he played a succession of Italian favorites, and sang

using words in the local dialects, including *Piemontese, Calabrese, Napolitano*, and *Siciliano*!



Beginning with *Ciribiribin*, then *Reginella Campagnola* (better known in the US as the Woodpecker song), Reno

sang *Calabrese* and *Neopolitan* love songs, and finished with the tarantella: *C'e la luna mezz'o mare*.

Now it was the birthday boy's turn. Frank
Montoro played 6 pieces, and wowed the
audience. He first mentioned his appreciation of
Reno's playing. Then he started with *Here's that*Rainy Day, and swung into Roman Guitar. At one
point, Frank mentioned that he felt like an Italian
salami sandwich, playing after Reno Di Bono and
before Peter Di

Bono. Frank continued with *Piel Canela* (lit. Cinnamon Skin), and *Cry Me a River*. He stopped to introduce *La Virgen de la Macarena* with some ironic words about the "sport" of bull



fighting, and the fact that the song title is "THE" Virgin of Macarena – was there only one? Frank finished with *Under Paris Skies*. He played it in a wonderful lilting waltz rhythm. There was a standing ovation. Skyler then led everyone in a chorus of *Happy Birthday*, while Lynn accompanied on accordion.

After that, it was break time, and we proceeded to demolish a huge birthday cake celebrating Frank's 90th birthday.

#### NOVEMBER MEETING, Cont'd

The **Peter Di Bono Trio** played for the second half of this program. Depending on how one counts, they played some 40 tunes. Many pieces were medleys of 3 or more tunes. They wove tunes from different musicals and various movies into their medleys. The Trio includes Peter, **Harriet Newhart** playing violin and **Steve Hanson** on double bass.



They started with *Mio Carino* as a single, followed by *Mattinata*. Peter called both of these "beautiful little Italian songs." Quite an understatement. They moved on to *Minute Waltz*, and the well-known tango *El Choclo* (lit. the Corn Cob, but its most famous lyrics are about tango as a way of life!).

There was a waltz medley based on *Always*. Peter dedicated this to his mother. Then Peter introduced an old friend, **Jeremy Consolo**, from Trieste originally, then Israel and now the US. He dedicated the next tune to him: *Jerusalem of Gold*. Harriet's violin carried the Klezmer passages. They followed this with a rousing version of *Brahm's* 


Hungarian Dance No 5. Then the trio started a medley including I'm in the Mood for Love, Puttin' on the Ritz and Dancing Cheek to Cheek.

They carried on with *I Got Rhythm* combined with *Fascination*, which it certainly was. The next theme included *Bésame Mucho, Maria My Own* (story of Maria von Trapp) and *You Belong to Me*, *Moonlight in Vermont*. These were all dance favorites in the big band era, and nowadays at events and in dance clubs.

They played selections from *Singin'* in the Rain. Peter mentioned that this was composed by Xavier de la Prade's father: Nacio Herb Brown. Xavier was in the audience – and drew a round of applause. The Trio then played selections from Sound of Music. This included Sound of Music, Edelweiss, Doe a deer ... and Climb Ev'ry Mountain before returning to Sound of Music. It was a wonderful treat to listen to great music played with a perfect rhythm, beautiful arrangements that featured the violin and accordion swapping theme and harmony.

In the same way, the trio played a combo of selections from *Mary Poppins* and *My Fair Lady*. These included *On the Street Where You Live*, *With a Little Bit of Luck, The Rain in Spain*, *Wouldn't It be Loverly*, and of course, *I Could Have Danced All Night*.

This writer (Scotty Williamson) at least feels that you could not listen to a better performance anywhere.

# Message from the President by Lynn Ewing

Dear Friends

May I wish you all Happy Holidays, and a season filled with music, laughter, and friendship. It is Thanksgiving as I write, and my heart is filled with thankfulness over the richness that the accordion has brought to my life.

I started playing at age 7, and played seriously for 12 years, before putting the accordion aside for about 25 years while I moved from my San Diego hometown to Minnesota to be a flight attendant, and then to the SF Area to raise my family. In the early 90's, I met **Frank Montoro**, and he invited me to the SF Accordion Club, which at the time was known as the Bay Area Accordion Club (BAAC) and was the only club in the area.

Through my association with the club, my life has been transformed. It was through my friendships in the club that I started playing with the ACE ensemble, directed by my mentor, Joe Smiell Sr, and AbsolutAccord, directed by Richard Yaus. I began attending various accordion events such as Galla-Rini camp, Silver Falls, Las Vegas, Coupe Mondiale, Blakely Island gathering of friends, the AAA festival, the ATG festival, the Frank Marocco Accordion event, and even went to Castelfidardo for the European Marocco Event. I have been fortunate to play under the baton of many conductors in orchestras and ensembles, attending workshops put on by experts, and meeting other accordionists that have become some of my closest friends.

I want to give particular thanks to Mary Tokarski, who has given some workshops that have been especially useful. While in Las Vegas, I attended Mary's workshop on memorizing, and I will share just one tip from that might be helpful to all of us. Mary started by giving us a list of about 12 random words, and gave us 3 minutes to try to memorize it IN THE ORDER listed. None of us could do it.

Then she said, "Ok, I'm going to give you 30 seconds to memorize these same 12 words in a different order". She put them in a sentence, and of course, we were able to easily remember them. The point is, that if you can think of your music in terms of musical phrases and paragraphs, it will be so much easier than trying to remember individual notes or measures.

Also at the Las Vegas Convention, I had the opportunity to co-present a workshop with **Stas Venglevski** on playing duets. I love Stas' compositions, and it was such a treat to share his music with the many attendees of the workshop. Stas will be playing for us as the featured performer at our July meeting, which will be just before the Accordionists and Teacher's Guild Festival (ATG) being held near the airport area here in San Francisco. I hope you will all make plans to attend this wonderful event, which will give you all the opportunity to participate in workshops and even the orchestra without having to haul yourself and/or your accordion on an airplane!

We are looking forward to seeing all of you at our December meeting, where we invite you to bring along holiday treats to share during our break. Again, Happy Holidays, and Stupendous Squeezin' to all!

Start planning for the Accordionists and Teachers Guild (ATG) National Festival, this summer. You might want to consider preparing a piece for evaluation or even competition, or consider playing in the Festival Orchestra. Or just come to hear some amazing accordionists in our own backyard, or educate yourself attending workshops. **Betty Jo Simon**, the president of ATG, offers the following information:

There will be sessions for Evaluation only for both solo and ensembles. There will be an Entertainment Showcase for ensembles with accordion and any instrumentation.

Competitions for all age and ability levels will be offered in categories of Solo, Duet, Chamber Ensembles, Orchestras including Electronic Accordion, Adult Hobby, Ethnic, Polka, Jazz, and Original music categories. Some of them offer cash prizes.

Then there is the US Championship and Coupe Mondiale qualifying categories for the most advanced players. These competitions are open for attendance by festival goers.

Last year we offered 2 special categories; "All American Salute" Solo Competition with a \$200 prize for 1st place which specifies any two original solos by any two American accordionist composers and "Tango Times Two" Solo Competition with a \$200 prize for 1st place which calls for any two original or arranged Tango solos by Piazzolla, Galliano, or traditional composers of tango music.

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



